Any other fee corresponding to fees that have to be paid by local students	Please anticipate to pay a certain amount of fee in order to process study permit, visa authorization (telex visa), limited stay visa (VITAS) and Multiple Exit Re-entry Permit (MERP). Further information of the fee will be informed individually once the student received the Letter of Offer after the admission process is made.
Mentoring/buddy system	Office of International Affairs provides a buddy system for every international student. It will be announced individually by the Admission staff prior to their arrival date.

Eligibility Transfer Credit	 Nomination to partners under University-based Agreement must go through the Office of International Affairs at the University level with the following requirements: 1. Enrolled as an active student of UGM during application and program exchange 2. Students shall pay the prevalent tuition fee to the home institution or according to the MoU between UGM and the partner university. 3. 3 – 6th semester student (2nd – 3rd year student) 4. Minimum obtained credits: 60 credits 5. Have a minimum TOEFL Score of 550 or IELTS Score 6.5 or according to the required score by the partner university 6. Have minimum cumulative Grade Point Average (GPA) of 3.00 or according to required score by the partner university 7. Recommendation letter from academic supervisor 8. Recommendation/Nomination letter from the Faculty (Dean/Vice Dean of Academic Affairs) 9. Follow all the regulations which have been set by UGM and the partner university 10.
