Program Criteria

- Have completed the Buddy Program OR Peer Mentor Program as a Buddy OR Peer Mentor before Session 1 2026
- 2. Plan to enrol in at least one unit for Session 1 2026 at Macquarie University
- You will be required to undertake 15 hours training and volunteer at least 40 hours over the session including Kickstart, facilitation of Buddy Peer Support and Buddy Social Events
- 4. You must acknowledge and abide by the Student Code of Conduct in all matters, on and off Campus. Buddy Team Leaders also need to complete additional compliance requirements: 'Recognising and Responding to Disclosures of Sexual Misconduct' Training.

#### POSITION PURPOSE

The Buddy Program is a peer support network designed to help students transition smoothly into university life. It provides ongoing social connection and guidance through peer relationships and a range of on- and off-campus activities. Buddies also assist students in settling into life at Macquarie University, Sydney, and Australia, and in navigating the various supports and services available.

Buddy Team Leaders are expected to be actively involved in the program for the full session and to attend all inperson events, including training sessions, day trips, and on-campus activities. Each Buddy Team Leader is required to complete a minimum of 40 hours of program-related activity per session, excluding training hours.

#### 2. HOW WILL THIS PROGRAM BENEFIT YOU?

By becoming a Team Leader, you will develop transferable skills such as leadership, cultural sensitivity and communication skills to facilitate Buddy and student interactions. As a Team Leader, you will bring expertise from your experience as a Buddy OR Mentor and use that knowledge to guide your small team of Buddies and assist with their development in the program. These skills will prove useful for the remainder of your time at Macquarie and throughout your career. Upon completion of the program requirements the Team Leader will receive:

- Certificate of Service to recognise their contribution to the Macquarie community
- Macquarie University Microcredential
- Employability Skills and Referee support for future Job Applications (within 6 months of completing the program)
- Official co-curricular recognition on <u>AHEGS</u>

#### 3. WHAT WILL YOU NEED TO DO?

- Represent Macquarie University Buddy Program at official Macquarie University events
- Contribute to the development of engaging peer initiatives such as social events, workshops, networking sessions, development and upskilling opportunities
- · Assist the Student Engagement Team with developing and facilitating the in-person Buddy training sessions
- Contribute to Kickstart, with particular focus on: Onboarding, orientation and transition periods (Kickstart + Weeks 1-4 of Session) AND;
- Contribute to in Session Social periods with a particular focus: Social integration and personal development (Weeks 5-13 of Session)
- Provide feedback about the program and other university services as required.

FORMAL TEAM LEADER/BUDDY RELATIONSHIP	Team Leaders will be responsible for guiding and supporting Buddies through the program as an escalation point. This is done through group messages and supervision at Buddy Social Events.	Weeks 1 – 13
MQ Buddy Peer Support	Buddy Peer Support occurs in the first 4 weeks of Session. Team Leaders support Buddies who supply a one-to-one peer support model via the Macquarie University Mentor Network (Peoplegrove), which includes weekly templates and timely updates.	Weeks 1 - 4
Community Peer Support	Community Peer Support occurs after the first 4 weeks of Session. Team Leaders support Buddies to deliver events that encourage students to find support among peers in the wider community.	Weeks 5 - 13
