# GRADUATE OUTCOMES SURVEY

The Graduate Outcomes Survey (GOS) is a national survey of recent higher education graduates conducted for the Australian Government Department of Education, Skills and Employment.

The GOS measures short-term employment outcomes including skills utilisation, further study activities and graduate satisfaction.

graduates (41% of graduates who completed a course in 2022) told us what they were doing three to six months after their course completion and how they felt about Macquarie and their course.
