2. POSITION PURPOSE

The [Macquarie University Peer Mentors](#) program is a co-curricular, university-wide peer support program that connects new students with current students, to enhance their experience and improve their chances of success during the transition to university. As a Peer Leader, you support a small group of Peer Mentors who provide new 1st year students with the tools to navigate their new learning environment, systems, services, and support networks here at Macquarie.

3. HOW WILL THIS PROGRAM BENEFIT YOU?

By becoming a Peer Leader, you will develop transferable skills such as organisational, leadership, and communication skills and the ability to facilitate Mentor and Mentee interactions. As a Peer Leader, you will bring expertise from your experience as a Peer Mentor and use that knowledge to guide your small Peer Mentor team, and assist with their development in the program. These skills will prove useful for the remainder of your time at Macquarie and throughout your career. Upon completion of the program requirements the Peer Leader will receive:

- Certificate of Service to recognise their contribution to the Macquarie community

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4. WHAT WILL YOU NEED TO DO?

- Represent the Macquarie University Peer Mentors Program at official Macquarie University events
- Contribute to the development of engaging peer initiatives such as events, workshops, networking sessions, training and upskilling sessions
- Assist the Student Engagement Team with developing and facilitating the Peer Mentoring training session
- Contribute to the development of, and facilitate, interactive face-to-face and online workshops and events for students, with a particular focus on the orientation and transition periods (first seven weeks of session)

- Assist the Student Engagement Team to develop and facilitate a schedule of events and professional development opportunities for Peer Mentors
- Provide feedback about the program and other university services as required.
