Writing assistive technology or speech-to-text software offers a wide range of benefits that can help improve the academic writing process.

How can you benefit from using speech-to-text software?

- Improve speed and efficiency: speech-to-text software allows your device to type as you speak.
- Explaining your ideas verbally can often be faster than typing. Speech-to-text could be used to dictate notes, essays, and reports depending on your needs.
- Reduction in typing errors: speech-to-text software can help to reduce common typing mistakes.
- Reduced physical strain on hands and wrists.
- Improve focus: speech-to-text may reduce the time spent on the typing to allow more time to focus on the content and structure of the writing.

Microsoft Office 365 Dictation

The Microsoft speech-to-text feature is known as **Microsoft Dictation**. It allows you to use your voice to create documents, emails, notes, and presentations, within the Office 365 online suite or apps. For an overview of all features go to <u>Dictate in Microsoft 365</u>.

Microsoft Office 365 Transcribe

- The Transcribe feature converts audio files into transcripts.
- Upload an audio or video file (mp3 or mp4) and Microsoft 365 will generate an editable transcript with timestamps.
- Students can upload 300 minutes of audio for free each month.
- You can take notes and quote directly from the transcripts with timestamps.
- Transcribe can also be used to record a live conversation, and generate a transcript for meetings.

The Apple speech-to-text feature is known as **Dictation** and is available on macOS, iOS, iPadOS.

- It can be used across different applications and devices.
- Student pre-set a shortcut so it is convenient to activate.
